Crowning **'Waterford's Month of Landscape'** NLF 2023, a Landscape Alliance Ireland initiative in partnership with Bioregional Weaving Lab. Waterford (BWLW), Irish Landscape Institute (ILI), Waterford City & County Council (WCCC) & the local community is supported by BWLW, ILI, WCCC, Bord Bia, Southern Regional Assembly & MKO Planning & Environmental Consultants; it will review the evolution of Ireland's landscape management, thinking, action and success/failure to date, the many diverse players/stakeholders involved, their roles, responsibilities & resources. It will describe the co-ordinated, integrated structure required to deliver the National Landscape Strategy 2015-2035 (NLS) as per the European Landscape Convention 2000 (ELC) and EU EIA/SEA Directives. “Ireland signed and ratified the Council of Europe’s European Landscape Convention (ELC) which came into effect on 1 March 2004.....It obliges Ireland to implement policy changes and objectives concerning the management, protection and planning of the landscape.... The National Landscape Strategy will be used to ensure compliance with the ELC and to establish principles for protecting and enhancing it while positively managing its change.
